

We wanted to ensure that local priorities still reflect what matters most to residents, from improving public spaces to supporting community projects that make Surbiton a vibrant, inclusive place for everyone.

We asked for your project ideas to help make Surbiton an even better place and to support our aims of:

- developing, promoting, and enhancing Surbiton's parks, streets, and open spaces
- implementing innovative local projects that benefit and attract residents and businesses to the area
- encouraging the creation and maintenance of community hubs, forums, 'Friends of' groups, and residents' associations

To make this happen, we used a platform called **Dialogue**, where you could post your ideas, comment on others, join the conversation, and rate the ideas that inspired you.



Dialogue is an online platform designed to support inclusive, constructive discussions between organisations and residents at the early stages of decision-making. It provides a simple way for people to share ideas, give feedback, and discuss local priorities together.

Example from Dialogue: Surbiton High Street

Idea: "Introduce some planting points along the street to make it feel greener, more of an avenue. Some points of the street being width restricted to make the street safer. Also allowing more outside space for dining / cafe."

Comment: "Yes I agree. Surbiton high street needs to be made more greener so that it's better healthier living. It removes the notion of the concrete city feel."

TOGETHER

Celebrating Surbiton's history, culture, and community spirit was a clear theme.

Residents wanted to see more local events, art, and opportunities for people to come together.

This includes improvements to shared spaces such as Tolworth Broadway and local shopping parades, along with support for cultural projects, artists, and performers.

GREENER

Many residents highlighted the importance of protecting and improving our green spaces and recreation areas, planting more trees, and supporting biodiversity.

This includes projects that enhance parks and promote community awareness of Surbiton's natural environment.

SAFER

Residents told us they value a safer, more welcoming public spaces, especially around key areas such as Surbiton Station, Berrylands Station, Victoria Road, and Tolworth Broadway.

Improving these spaces will help make them more connected, attractive, and accessible for everyone.

There was also support for projects that help vulnerable residents and for community groups that improve local spaces through clean-ups and maintenance.

FAIRER

There was strong support for increasing opportunities for sport, play, and physical activity, particularly for those who may not usually have access to them.

Residents also supported training and development projects that build skills and strengthen community organisations.
