

Engagement and including everyone in the solution

Since April 2024, the Community Safety Team has

Engaged with the community:

- Delivered training sessions, hosted engagement events, and participated in community activities.
- Approximately 1515 community members attended.

Engaged with professionals:

- Provided staff training, attended professional events and boards, and contributed to wider engagement activities.
- Approximately 2554 professionals attended.

Key topics covered include:

Antisocial behaviour, Hate Crime, Prevent, Exploitation, Domestic Abuse, Violence against Women and Girls, Crime and Community Safety, Online Safety and Modern Slavery.

We'd like more police out and about

- <u>Safer Streets Summer Town Centre</u> <u>Initiative</u>
- More Met Police Officers were out in the borough, the police also increased the number of officers in neighbourhood teams
- Launch of <u>'Met Engage'</u> An online platform keeping the community connected to their local policing team
