## CANBURY GARDEN - Playground Design






The revised design is a response from the feedback from recent community engagement, through the public meeting and 'Let's Talk' process. The new design includes the various elements highlighted in etc'.

The formalised play has moved more to the periphery of the green space, leaving a large expanse for informal play, ball games and picnics. To the northeast there is more tree planting to define the edge of the existing path and a 'rewilded' area further to the east, some of which has already been fenced.


The equipment responds to the feedback, providing zip slides, monkey bars and climbing. An area of seating, reflecting the crowns of the Saxon Kings, (potentially inscribed with their names?) has been sited closer to the toddler playground and close to the existing footpath network and in itself a destination honeypot for picnics and as a place to meet and enjoy.

The inclusive play area uses the new footpath as a spine and has areas leading off it, traversed by a 'zebra' crossings. The 'off shoot' loops have a variety of interest from a simple mound to weave posts, clatter bridges and balance beams as well as a natural willow arch through to the sensory area which has smell, sound, texture, touch and sight stimulation.

Overall the new design is installed on the existing flat topography of the area and links the footpath to the north and south. To
