| Barker Close    | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Issue with where people park - inconsiderate on corners. But not an issue with lack of spaces. Maybe yellow lines on corners?</li> <li>• Please do not introduce parking permits or limitations, that would be horrendous for local residents and businesses</li> <li>• No available parking for visitors</li> </ul>   |
| California Road | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Loads of abandoned cars in the area's</li> <li>• We have small children - so we are scared to move the cars in case we can't park again. Loads of cars are abandoned / some for 6 months plus. No one picks them up or maintains them.</li> <li>• We have one car</li> <li>• Garage in Westbury Road dumps cars here and has for the last year. That's the only issue</li> <li>• The parking is lovely, there is enough and in the eight years I've been living here, they have never been completely full. There is always place to park.</li> <li>• Cars dumped on regular basis, largely by local garage. Remain unmoved for weeks/months at time &amp; DO NOT belong to residents on the road. Renders road completely out of use for people who do live here.</li> <li>• The parkings are great, what is not fine is how Kingston road has been utterly botched. With the sticks for the cycle lane and the new curb things, it is harder than ever for buses and cars to drive.</li> <li>• The garage next door to Aldi regularly dumps several cars in California Road. I have confronted them several times in the act. They had loaders dropping off damaged cars which stay for months.</li> <li>• Parking in curves, blocking pedestrians and do not respect yellow lines. They parking in double lines in the entrance to California road from Kingston Road. Sometimes no access</li> <li>• Disused cars are dumped in this area, residents parking is desperately needed</li> <li>• As a resident in Cali road there is no parking available for us to come home to. I have 2 children and sometimes have to park on another street as there is no parking on the road I reside on</li> <li>• It's horrific and get worse. I cannot recall the last time I could park near my house, I take my car to Westbury Road &amp; walk back. There is an overwhelming industrial traffic every day.</li> </ul> |

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|               | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Residents of the 14 cottages have no off street parking and are unable to park in California Road. Like Beresford Road should be treated as a special case.</li> <li>Cars are parked (dumped) for months at a time by nearby repair garages on St John's road and wellington crescent. Residents of the Kingston east development all park on California road</li> <li>I've submitted this before, but after learning the history of this consultation, I believe at the very minimum a PPA is essential on California Road, as it suffers the worst parking pressure.</li> <li>I could winge away but 200 characters isn't enough space for me!! We need another meeting to discuss our concerns?</li> <li>It is often difficult to park close to where we live.</li> <li>Unable to park outside or near to our house, therefore we have been unable to purchase an EV, so without a car.</li> <li>Cars are parked in this street for long periods of time from the car garage near Aldi</li> <li>New flats parking cars; cars being dumped on the street, reduces number of spaces available. California Rd has no access to off-street parking and I regularly have to park up to a mile away to park.</li> <li>No available parking for visitors</li> </ul> |
| England Way   | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>I have no concerns. All residents and visitors are respectful when parking.</li> <li>No available parking for visitors</li> </ul>   |
| Georgia Road  | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Never any space for residents. Half of Kingston uses the area as free parking. I'm sick of it</li> <li>No available parking for visitors</li> </ul>   |
| Kingston Road | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>Hardly ever any spaces and near impossible for guests to park locally</li> <li>There should be places to park for those who live nearby but don't have assigned parking</li> <li>HA/council.I had no choice but to accept my flat offer from the council due to being disabled and having a young child.Kingston council/HA tenant in the new build should be able to apply for a permit</li> <li>Kingston east were told we can park on surrounding roads. If you permit the area it will be a huge issue for many here. My partner is registered disabled &amp; parking very far away isn't an option.</li> </ul>   |

Professionals visit us during the week who use the street to park. Permit parking isn't the right thing to do in this street. This will cripple small businesses. I disagree!</li> <li>• KE residents were told when buying they could park on those roads. Residents on these roads also bought properties with no allocated parking. Restricting us from parking would cause major issues</li> <li>• Parking seems fine. There have been a few cars vandalised by a resident on our road.</li> <li>• Ridiculous suggestion, how will visitors park in the area for shops etc? Already very limited</li> <li>• Those in flats will have no parking option at all</li> <li>• I live in Kingston East development. Introducing parking permits in these roads will mean that residents in our building have nowhere to park nearby at all.</li> <li>• No concerns</li> <li>• I'm a homeowner from the new development on St Johns Road/Dickerage Lane. A short double yellow line prohibiting parking on Georgia Road at junction with Nevada Close is needed.</li> <li>• No available parking for visitors</li> </ul>   |
| As a Resident of Sherfield Close     | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Do not change the parkings. This is a money making scheme which we do not support. Instead of trying to take more money from us, spend money on fixing kingston road which is an embarrassment</li> <li>• Please no changes</li> <li>• People park on the pavement blocking paths instead of parking in bays more double yellow lines are need on roads, parking areas to stop this. one permit should be free per household.</li> <li>• No available parking for visitors</li> </ul>   |

Vehicles due to the amount. | As a Resident of Virginia Close      | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• We do not need a permit or whatsoever, it is good as it is. Please stop this nonsense.</li> <li>• No issue with day time parking. Problems start when people come back home, cars are parked incorrectly even on road bends, blocking entry for all kinds of cars (emergency, rubbish collection trucks)</li> <li>• No available parking for visitors</li> </ul>  |

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| As a Resident of Willow Road | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• I have a drive way so parking my car is no issue. Visitors have never had any issues with parking, even when I have had 3 cars visit at once.parking restrictions on willow road are unnecessary.</li> <li>• Living at the end of a closed road means not a lot of parking already, we have residents/visitors coming from the newly built flats in Kingston Road or Georgia Road which leaves us with nowhere to park.</li> <li>• The past years parking became horrible on our road. Everyone is using our road for parking and us residents struggling to park. It is horrible to come home every day and not being able to park.</li> <li>• Too many cars parked on road. This issue has risen since the block of apartments on Kingston Road opposite California Road was built with a planned shortage of parking spaces.</li> <li>• Parking on corners block footpath</li> <li>• Need residential parking. There is no parking space for the resident members. Parking situation has not really changed in 25yrs we've been residents, and no concerns.</li> <li>• number of cars parking on my road inconsiderately , blocking driveways and making it difficult for emergency vehicles. I would be in favour of some sort of parking control</li> <li>• People park opposite our house making it difficult to get off the driveway</li> <li>• There are drug dealers operating on the corner of California rd and Willow rd, and drug addicts at the entrance to the recreation ground. | As a Visitor to the Area | <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Far too much traffic on the Kingston Rd. Pay enough council tax without introducing permit parking to this area.</li> <li>• Some residents have more than 1 car and use public parking space than driveways. Although not illegal but it isn't fair for community.</li> <li>• Why not limit to 1 car permit per household?</li> <li>• Introducing a permit scheme will only move cars onto other roads, non permit roads in the locality.
